The Very First Anstead Reunion

Have you ever wondered how these Anstead Reunions got started in the first place? Well, one of our family members stumbled upon the minutes from the very first Anstead Family Reunion! Read on for all the details....

History and Minutes of the First Reunion of the descendants of Harry and Mary Stock Anstead

On Sunday, June 20, 1954, the descendants of Harry and Mary Stock Anstead held their first annual reunion at the Anstead home in Cresson, Pennsylvania.

Plans for the affair were begun early in the spring during a weekend when the Grimes and Stanton families were visiting at Fred and Edna Anstead's home in Montgomery, Michigan.

Russell was given the task of writing to the brothers and sisters not present, and to the aunts and uncles of the family, to invite them. Agnes volunteered to prepare a chicken dinner, if some others would help.

Early in the week preceding the big day, Agnes Grimes and Mary Stanton went to Cresson and began preparations. At Montgomery, Fred and Edna butchered and stuffed 25 chickens and arraigned to have them roasted at a bakery in Hillsdale, Michigan. Next, they removed the stuffing, then froze chickens and stuffing separately in dry ice and transported all to Cresson on Saturday.

On Saturday: Roy and Mary Alice arrived from Scranton area with Timmy, Pammy and Phillip (had been visiting Mary Alice's parents).

Ellsworth and Pearle arrived from Washington, D.C. accompanied by Bobby and Howard and Betty. Clarence Grimes, Claude, Eloise and Claudia came from Detroit

Bob and Mary Ellen Mix Illig with children David, Edward and Clair from Ebensburg.

Paul and Irma Mix Pacior with Paul and Karen arrived and went to Frances' home.

Russell, Helen. Paul. John and Helen Margaret arrived Sunday morning from Ellwood City.

When all were ready for Mass, Roy took moving pictures as each emerged from the house.

Solemn High Mass, for the repose of the soul of Mother, Mary Stock Anstead, was celebrated at 10:30 a.m. at St. Francis Church. Father Morgan McDermott was celebrant; Fathers Leonard and Ackerson were Deacon and sub-Deacon. All the families received communion in a body.

(Permission to take coffee before Mass was requested of Father McDermott by Charlotte and Mary. It was granted. This dispensation from complete fast for a good reason, before receiving Holy Communion was a new change. There was some reluctance on the part of persons who lived in cities, to take advantage of it, while those who lived in rural areas are more familiar and accepting. Much discussion took place)

Several weeks before, Charlotte made arrangements with the pastor to have the Mass. At that time he commended the concept of starting the reunion's activities with Mass attendance since the Church encourages family reunions.

Following Mass, Agnes, Charlotte, Mary, and Margaret served a chicken dinner, with all the trimmings at tables in the back yard. It was a perfect June day and everyone enjoyed an "all they could eat" meal under the trees.

After dinner, a business meeting was conducted, with Fred as temporary chairman-(see minutes of business meeting).

All agreed it was a grand idea to have an annual reunion and expressed regret that Rupert and Leo and their families were not able to be present.

Minutes of Business Meeting June 20, 1954

The first annual Anstead reunion meeting was called to order by Fred Anstead who was appointed temporary chairman.

It was unanimously agreed to hold an annual reunion, at Cresson at Papa's home as long as he lived.

It was unanimously agreed that Fred was a fine leader and should be chairman for 1955.

Agreed that each year, the chairman would decide that type of meal, and everyone would cooperate with his plans.

Agreed that we would always start the reunion day with Mass for the repose of the soul of our Mother, Papa would decide the time, etc. of Mass.

Motion by Roy, seconded by Charlotte that we need a historian, and nominated Russell for the job. Motion carried.

Moved by Aunt Edna Stock that the reunion be held on the last Sunday of June. Seconded by Uncle Harry Stock. Motion carried.

As no other business was brought up, it was agreed to adjourn the meeting with a hearty "thank you" to Fred and Edna, Agnes, Mary, Charlotte, and Margaret.
