Cecilia Flick wrote in "Dr. Lawrence Flick As I Knew Him," the following about his mother Elizabeth Sharbaugh:

"From all reports, Grandmother Flick was very industrious. Besides the work for her growing family, she helped in the fields, before Elizabeth and Albert were old enough to take over. On a farm, the milking of the cows, the feeding and care of the pigs and chickens fall to the women. Grandmother also raised flax and hemp which she spun into linen for bed sheets, table supplies, and clothing; hemp for bed ticks, and wool for their clothing, which she also made. It was necessary to card and wash the flax and hemp before spinning. Of course, the children could help with this. Owing to the high cost of calico and muslin during the Civil War, twenty-eight cents a yard, one year she spun one hundred yards of these materials. Dr. Flick kept the old spinning wheel."

LORANS WYLAND, of Spangler, was born June 1850, in Butler county, son of Nicholas Wyland and grandson of Lorans Wyland, who was born in Germany and about 1830 emigrated to the United States, making his home for three or four years in New York city, where he was employed in a market. He then moved to Clearfield township, Butler county, where he passed the remainder of his life as a farmer. He hauled the first brick for the Summit Roman Catholic Church of Butler county. He was a member of the Roman Catholic Church. Lorans Wyland married Susanna Monowill, a native of Germany, of French extraction, and their family consisted of the following children: John, a sea-captain; Nicholas, of whom later; Catherine, wife of William Gallagher; and Susanna, wife of Barney Gallagher. The death of Mr. Wyland occurred in 1867.

Nicholas Wyland, son of Lorans and Susanna (Monowill) Wyland was born in Germany, and was thirteen years old when brought to this country by his parents. He spent his life as a farmer and lumberman, dealing in the Pittsburgh markets. He held several township offices, was a staunch Democrat and a member of the Roman Catholic Church. He married Elizabeth Smith, who bore him the following children: Catherine, wife of Nicholas Reatt; Lorans, of whom later; Anthony, farmer of St. Austin, Pennsylvania.; John, deceased, carpenter of Butler county; Nicholas, proprietor of the Blair House at Ebensburg; Peter, farmer of Colport, Centre county; Joseph, of Spangler; and Margaret, wife of Joseph Lantzy.

Lorans Wyland, son of Nicholas and Elizabeth (Smith) Wyland, received his education in the common schools and was obliged at fifteen, in consequence of the death of his father, to remain on the farm and assist his mother in rearing the younger children. At the age of twenty-one he and his brother Anthony purchased the homestead, and four or five years later Mr. Wyland bought out his brother's interest, thus becoming sole owner of the property, on which he has since lived, giving his attention to agricultural pursuits in connection with the lumber business and also dealing in coal lands. Since 1880 he has been in partnership with Joseph A. Gray under the firm name of Gray & Wyland, in the lumber and real estate business, operting in north Cambria county and also in

West Virginia,. He is connected with the firm of Albert P. Wyland, furniture dealers and undertakers of Spangler, and was one of the organizers of the Spangler Bank. Ever since the borough was organized, about twenty years ago, he has served on the school board, which was the first in the township. He is a Democrat and a member of St. Patrick;s Church, having served on the committee ever since the church was organized.

According to a Memorandum of John Flick Sr., (son of Peter George Flick) Taken in 1888, and information from passages in Cecilia Flick's book, "Dr. Lawrence Flick As I Knew Him." they says:

"In the middle of March of 1830, Peter George Flick and his brother John or (Johann), along with their families set sail for America. They, traveled from Alstadt, (The city of Wissenbourg grew up around the old town of Alstadt) to Rotterdam by wagon, the trip took 19 days. From there they sailed for New York; and landed in New York in May of 1830, after having been on the water for 39 days. They remained in New York for 8 days. Then started to Ohio, by way of Albany to Buffalo and Erie, travelling by canal. After reaching Buffalo Peter George and his family decided to go to Pennsylvania to work with friends at Partical Furnace. At Buffalo the brothers parted, Peter George and his family retracing their steps, and his brother John continuing his travels, finally settling in Canada. The brothers never met again, but before John Flick (son of Peter George) died, his son Edward, having learned the address of his Uncle John's family, took his father to visit them. John (Peter Georges brother), had died, but it was a happy reunion for the other members of the family."

After leaving Buffalo the family traveled by wagon and canal reaching Particle Furnace in the latter part of June, and got work at once. They stayed here for 5 years - 9 months. In time they found a Catholic settlement in Loretto and decided to move there. They moved to Loretto in the fall of 1835, and settled on a track of land in the vicinity of Loretto, where they build a log cabin. After some years a frame house was built, and in this house some of the Flicks lived up to the year 1956. When they got to Loretto Mr. Flick worked on the old Portage Railroad, hitching and hauling cars with horses, as well as cutting stone for the railroad. Some of the sons worked on the harvest, and cut cordwood to make charcoal, and stoked furnaces. According to Cecilia Flick in her book "Dr. Lawrence Flick, As I Knew Him", George Peter Flick was a stone mason of some repute in his home town.

Notes for Joseph Flick:

In the middle of March 1830, Peter George Flick and his brother John or Johann, accompanied by their families left Altenstadt or Alstadt (Alsace) France, now a sub city of Wissembourg, and set sail for America, they landed in New York in May of 1830. John and his family continued on to Canada, where they settled. In 1835 Peter George and his family settled near Loretto, in Cambria Co. Pennsylvania.

Notes for JOSEPH FLICK:

Joseph Flick was born in Drachenbroon, in the parish of Keffenach near Strassburg. Drachenbroon is spelled Drachenbronn today and is now called Drachenbronn-Birlenbach as the two sites recently merged. They are both in the Canton de Soultz-sous-Forets which consists of 19 communes. Two of which are Drachenbroon-Birlenbach and Keffenach. The word commune means municipality

At the time of his marriage he resided in the parish of Atenstadt, in the courtyard Gutlouthof, so called because a Leper Hospital stood there in the middle ages. Gutlouthof is about 20 minutes from Altenstadt in a southern direction, lying on the main street, there were one reaches the side road to go to Coisberg. On the marriage certificate of a daughter of his it was written that his occupation was weaver or TEXTOR. He and his wife are listed as tenets of the Courtyard Gutlouthof.

"Altenstadt itself as its name indicates simply means, (Old Town) and lies in the area in which a Roman Castle called Concordia stood. Numerous antiquities, such as coins, sarcophagi, and a Roman sandstone altar consecrated to the God Mercury have been found there. After the Romans came the Franks, and then the Norwegians. When King Dergobert founded the famous Benedictine monastery of Wissenbourg more and more people settled around the monastery, and in this way sprung up the new city Wissenbourg. The old Wissenbourg was then however simply called Altstadt. In the middle ages Alstadt at times suffered repeatedly by wars and was destroyed, this for the last time in this so called farmers war (Bauernkriege)." The word Alstadt, I belive is the German for Altenstadt.

Taken from a letter to Edward Flick from Ludwig Fisher pastor of Altenstadt dated 20th January 1908

THE THIRTY YEAR WAR:

The objective of the 30 years war was the balance of power between Catholics and Protestants in all of Germany. However, the war was fought very hard in the Palatinate because the Palatine Elector was one of the most powerful of the Protestant rulers. Says a writer who describes this atrocity:

"Turenne, who had received definite orders from Versailles to devastate the Palatinate, did his work thoroughly. Once more the monotonous tale of misery must be told: Nobleman, citizen, peasant plundered; fields laid waste; cattle carried off; even the clothing torn, from the backs of the wretched victims. What could not be carried away, was destroyed; even the bells and organs were taken from the churches. At one time seven cities and nineteen villages were burning; starvation once more threatened the homeless peasant."

After the 30 years was over, most of the population were killed. There were almost no survivors in the Palatinate. Even those who were not forced to emigrate, were affected. In 1709 the winter was so severe, that the Rhine froze over and people were starving in the Palatinate. This was when Queen Anne advertised in the Palatinate that England would accept all German Protestants for immigration. Catholics who tried to enter England were given 5 guilders and sent back to Hannover. This was also when the tent city refugee camp outside of London was set up.

Cecilia Flick in her book "Lawrence Flick As I Knew Him", makes mention of the fact, that because of a religious persecution the Flicks once lived in London, and then returned to the Palatinate. This exodus must be what she is referring to.

The following is from information obtained by Edward Flick son of John Flick in 1908, it was compiled for him by Father Ludwig Fisher pastor of Altenstadt parish in Alsac France, and dated 20th of January 1908:

Marriage Certificate of Joseph Flick, Son of Joseph Flick and Elizabeth Keller, and Anna Mary Huber, daughter of Peter Huber and Magdalena Metzler, 1788. In the year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Eight, the tenth day of the month of November the banns having been proclaimed as is customary in my church, three times, three proximate Sundays having passed and in succession, and no impediments having been found, I the undersigned pastor in Altenstadt, in my church, at ten o'clock in the forenoon interrogated Joseph Flick, twenty-seven years old, son of Joseph Flick a citizen of Drachenbroon and the deceased Elizabeth Keller, therefore married, on account of residing in my parish and on account of having been born in the parish of Keffenach from where transmissorial documents have been furnished me and which are in my possession: and Anna Mary Huber, about twenty years old, daughter of Peter Huber Citizen of Altenstadt and Tennant of the community farm (Gutlouten) and of the deceased Magdalen Metzler, heretofore married, in my parish: with their mutual consent given and assured on the word of these present, I have joined them in matrimony, witnesses present, Joseph Flick father of the bridegroom; Peter Huber Father of the bride; Kunries, a citizen of Altenstad; , Martin Seir, a citizen of this place; who subscribes with me, the bride having declared she does not know how to write, makes a sign, after this I have blessed them in accordance with the custom of Holy Mother Church.

The following was written in 1908:

According to Father Fisher, "Altenstadt itself as its name already indicates, is a very old place and lies in the area in which a Roman Castle called Concordia stood. Numberous Roman antiquities, such as coins, sarcophaghi, a Roman sandstone altar consecrated to the God Mercury have been found; and north of Altenstadt lies the Roman burial place, more than two hektors in extent, where many hundred urns, large and small have been dug up. The old Roman bridge over the Lauter River was replaced with a new one only about thirty years ago because it lay too deep down. In the priests garden we have found more than a dozen coins, mostly small ones, but one of Caesar Antonius Pius which was about as big as a dollar."

"After the Romans came the Franks, the Norwegians, to Altenstadt as history tells us, and likewise a Norweigian sarcophigi have been dug up on the site of the church. However, when King Dergobert founded the famous Benedictine monastery of Wissembourg more and more people settled around the monastery and in this way sprung up the new city Weissenburg. The old Weissenburg was then however simply called Altstadt."

"In the middle ages Altstadt at times suffered repeatedly by war and was destroyed, this for the last time in this so called Farmers War (Bauernkriege)."

"As you may have noticed, Mr. Flick, all the Baptismal and Marriage services of your ancestors are subscribed to by Pastor Avril: it may interest you therefore to learn something about this gentleman. Francis Casimer Avril who by great learning and saintly heroic life, distinguished himself, was born in 1755: When he was only twenty-eight years old he was called to the pastorate of Alstadt by the chapter of Weissenburg (previous it was the Capuchins of Weissenburg who presided over the parish.) Mr. Avril remained pastor of Altstadt until the time of his death in the year 1814. He brought it about that the chapter of Weissenburg in the year 1759 had to build the parochial residence of Altastadt. The chapter received the tithes of Altenstadt and had to provide for the pastor. Prior to the Great Revolution."

"Mr. Avril was to become court chaplain to Prince Von Spier: he declined after the Revolution, the town of Weissenburg was offered him, he again declined. During the revolution when the churches were closed and the clergy mostly imprisoned, expelled and even beheaded, Mr. Avril kept himself hidden in the neighborhood in Palatinate places lying in the mountains, and came clandestinely, mostly at night to minister to his parochial children and administer the sacraments to them. He finally was arrested, taken to Strasburg and condemned to exile; nevertheless as soon as the bloody men of the Revolution had fallen, Mr. Avril again came to Altenstadt, where he remained pastor and where his memory is still in Benediction. One of the monumental slabs in front of

the church yard arose along side of the church is his gravestone."
